RMS Letter re Licence Conditions

On Monday 21/7/2014, Driving Instructors in NSW were sent a letter from the RMS outlining a new condition that has been added to our licences. This is as a result of recent investigations from ICAC relating to fraud. The investigations centred mainly on the Heavy Vehicle sector, however the flow on effect is that it includes all areas of driver training and assessing.

The condition is nothing too onerous and simply requires us to notify the RMS if we become aware of any situation of attempted corruption by someone attempting to obtain their licence or by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) or a Heavy Vehicle Assessor. We are already required under legislation to report any instance of misconduct or inappropriate action so this is really just extending that to include fraud or corruption.

The new condition will be printed on the back of our licences when they are next renewed, but in the meantime we must carry a copy of the letter with us at all times in case we are asked to produce it by an authorised officer. This could happen if the RMS conducts a spot audit at a registry car park when presenting someone for a test etc. We would suggest you make a couple of copies of the letter and carry one in each car you teach in as well as one for your diary for when you might be in a client's private vehicle.

We had no notice of this letter being sent out and like you, were concerned when you open an envelope and read the words Independent Commission Against Corruption and new condition on your licence. Some warning of this by the RMS would have been appreciated so that we could notify you ahead of time so that you didn't get freaked out. We will address this with the RMS.

Online Search tool

Last week we were contacted by Transport for NSW to let us know that they have launched an online search tool for P plate restricted vehicles. It's simple to use and allows you to enter the make and model of the vehicle to find out whether P plate drivers are allowed to drive it under the new conditions that come into effect from August 1st. We would suggest you notify all your clients of this great tool, and perhaps you could show them on your tablet or smart phone whilst they are in a lesson with you and find out if the cars they will be driving will be OK.

This tool features vehicles as far back as 1883 and has four possible results:

Allowed

These vehicles are allowed for P1/P2 drivers.

Banned

P1/P2 drivers must not drive these vehicles.

For review

These recently released or updated vehicles are being reviewed. Their approval status will be updated on our website soon.

Contact RMS

These older or unusual vehicles will need to be reviewed by [RMS](#).

The keys2drive administrator's have told us that their certificates did expire but have subsequently been renewed but may not have flowed through to all servers yet. If you have this issue, you can still click on "proceed" and it will take you to the site and you can access everything. There will be no harm to your computer.
